Previously released in the UK as *The Big Needle*, and later reprinted (US) with Follett's real name. Published without ISBN.

From the cover: The Big Hit is the latest in the successful Apples Carstairs series which began with The Big Needle and continued with The Big Black.

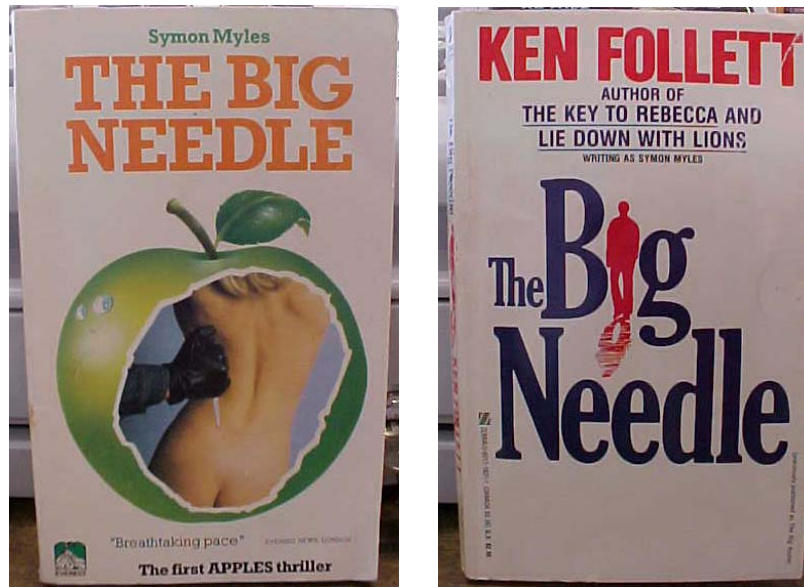

**Date Published:** 1975

**Description:** Second printing 1975. Mass-market paperback. Everest Books Ltd, London (4 Valentine Place, S.E.1) (1974) Fine. No dust jacket as issued. No marks, tears or creases. Lightest shelfwear scuffing. Clean and tight. 142p.; 18 cm. Rarely offered in any condition. The first book written by bestselling author Ken Follett, released under the pen name Symon Myles. The book was released in the UK in 1974, and later in the US as THE BIG APPLE (and later still in the US as The Big Needle-by Ken Follett writing as Symon Myles). Title page states "This is his first novel, " and identifies the name as a pseudonym of a Fleet Street reporter. The book is seldom seen in this state, which makes no mention of Follett's name.

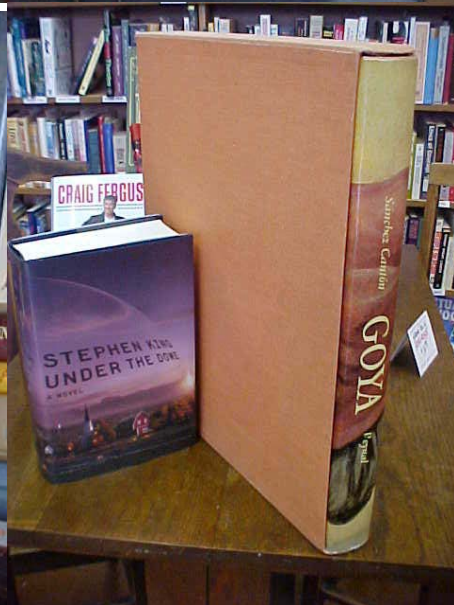
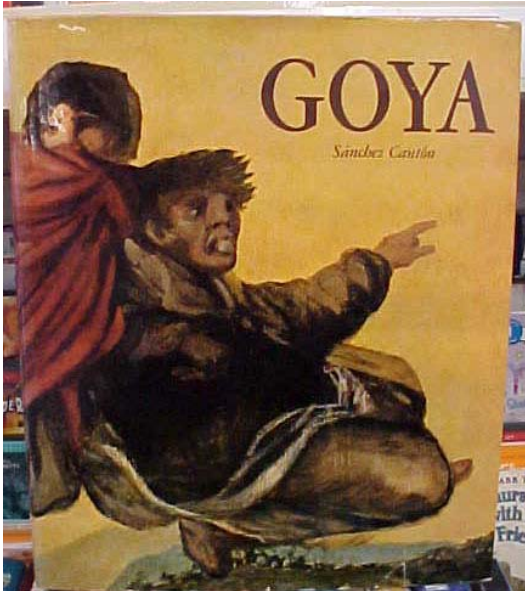
**Sanchez Canton, Francisco Javier**

**Description:** Goya by Francisco Javier Sanchez Canton, published by Reynal & Company, New York. First English language edition. From the Grand Monographs of Art series by Paolo Lecaldano. Illustrated with 114 color plates, including 9 large gatefolds and other folding plates; 77 other monochrome illustrations, some of which are mounted. 99 pages of text on laid paper. Large heavy folio, salmon cloth with matching slipcase. Slightest corner scuffing to slipcase. Book is fine. Dustjacket has slightest creasing and clipped upper edge of inner fold. Clean and bright interior. Overall dimensions 16.5 x 14 x 2 inches. A beautiful volume with an exquisite presentation of Goya's artwork.

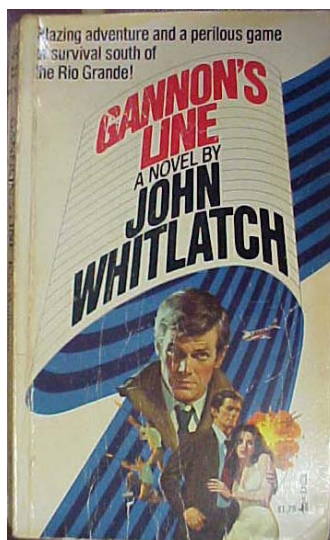

Scarcely found and rarely offered title from the last of the pulp fiction authors, John Whitlatch. A very collectible copy of the second book in his Gannon series, taking on "the sadistic genius who masterminded" an espionage ring with a secret base in the Baja. Scarce title. Light creasing to cover and spine.
